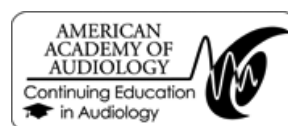
Parking is readily available. Please contact Guest Services for shuttle bus service throughout the Wilderness Territory.

This talk will survey the sorts of approaches that are currently employed, with focus on the opportunities that they create for patients. Practical issue that the audiologist need to consider will be discussed.

### 2:00–3:30 p.m. Programming Hearing Aids in the Ear Opposite to a Cochlear Implant

**Christina Runge-Samuels, PhD**

The use of a hearing aid in one ear and a cochlear implant in the other is becoming more common. Optimizing this bimodal listening configuration poses interesting programming challenges for both devices. In general, acoustic stimulation primarily provides low-frequency information while the cochlear implant provides mid- and high frequency information. The complementary nature of the two signals typically results in improved overall performance. Balancing the perceptions of acoustic and electric stimuli is important and is affected by many variables. This presentation will focus on the concept of bimodal hearing and clinical approaches to bimodal fitting in adults and children.

### 3:45–5:15 p.m. Objective Clinical Verification of Digital Hearing Aid Functions

**David Smriga, MA**

The seminar will cover the use of speech audibility instead of gain as a fitting target. There will be a discussion of identifying and overcoming the speech audibility limitations of fitting software. Testing full spectrum directivity on the patient's ear will be demonstrated and means for evaluating electronic feedback and noise reduction algorithms will be covered. The objective of the seminar is to improve patient performance and long term satisfaction.
