

## **Eligibility Criteria Grid**

Thank you for choosing to apply for a WSHA Foundation Scholarship and/or Research Grant. Please note the following:

- You may apply for up to two scholarships and one research grant per competition cycle (annually).
- The scholarship and grant selection committees have been instructed that a student may win more than one scholarship or both a scholarship and research grant in a given year if a student is the highest qualified candidate for both awards.
- Students may apply for scholarships and grants each year they are qualified. Students may be awarded scholarships or grants in multiple years.
- You may send in one transcript even if applying for two scholarships; the Foundation office will take care of attaching a copy to your other scholarship application.
- You may submit one set of recommendation letters and the Foundation office will duplicate copies as needed to make complete application packets; alternatively, you may invite separate letters for different scholarships or encourage those writing for you to customize each letter.

## **Research Grant**

<i>Background and significance.</i> Provide a brief summary of the existing research (with citations) relevant to the proposed research, and state clearly how the proposed research is projected to resolve theoretical or clinical issue(s) in speech-language pathology or audiology.
<i>Methods and procedures.</i> Provide a clear description of the subjects who will participate in the research and how they will be recruited. Give details regarding the procedures to be followed to collect the data, including the frequency and duration of the testing/therapy sessions and how the data will be reduced for analysis. Describe the facilities and resources available to conduct the proposed research, including space, access to subjects or clinical populations, and sources of computing or expert advice.
<i>Evaluation and data analysis.</i> Describe the data analysis methods to be used to answer the research question(s).
<i>Management plan and budget.</i> Describe the scope, including a timeline of the major activities of the project. Provide a budget and a budget justification.
