

WSHA Stanley Ewanowski Scholastic Award

This annual scholastic award is sponsored by the Wisconsin Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology Association to honor Dr. Stanley Ewanowski. The scholastic award has been named for Dr. Stanley Ewanowski because of his many years of outstanding service to the professions as clinician, teacher, and researcher as well as for his leadership in both WSHA and ASHA.

Guidelines for Application:

The scholastic award will be presented at the WSHA Convention in the spring of each year. The amount to be awarded during the WSHA Convention will be \$600. While there are no restrictions on how the money is to be spent, the intent is for it to be used toward education. To apply for the scholastic award, a student must meet the following conditions

1. Enrollment in an ESB accredited graduate program in the state of Wisconsin at the time of application. The award can be received following graduation.
2. Majoring in either Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology.
3. Completion of two semesters (at least 18 hours) of **graduate level** course work.
4. Submission of three letters of recommendation which describe the student's clinical and academic abilities. These letters may be from faculty members or supervisors of practicum.
5. Submission of an application form together with an official transcript of graduate coursework.

The completed application form, graduate transcripts and letters of recommendation **must be received by the WSHA Foundation on or before June 20, 2010.** Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified.
