Guidelines for Application:

This scholarship will be presented at the WSHA Convention in the spring of each year. The amount to be awarded during the WSHA Convention will be \$1,500. The intent is for the money to be used toward education. To apply for the scholarship, a student must meet the following conditions:

1. Be a graduate student currently in his or her first year of an M.S. or M.A. program.
2. Be in a speech-language pathology or audiology program in an accredited graduate program in the state of Wisconsin.
3. Submit two letters of recommendations that describe clinical and academic abilities. These letters may be from faculty members or supervisors of practicum.
4. Submit a completed application form along with an official transcript of all graduate coursework.

Preference will NOT be given to students with financial need. All applicants who qualify are encouraged to apply.

The completed application form, graduate transcript, and letters of recommendation **must be received by the WSHA Foundation on or before June 20, 2009.** Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified.
