

Jack Kile Scholarship

This annual scholarship is sponsored by Jack Kile, Ph.D., CCC-A. Dr. Kile's passion for audiology has influenced countless professionals in the fields of speech-language pathology and audiology. The scholarship was established for students with an indicated interest in pediatric audiology or educational audiology at either the undergraduate or graduate level.

Guidelines for Application:

This scholarship will be presented at the WSHA Convention in the spring of each year. The amount to be awarded during the WSHA Convention will be \$1,000. The intent is for the money to be used toward education costs. To apply for the scholarship, a student must meet the following conditions:

1. Be a graduate student in his or her first year of an accredited graduate program in audiology in the state of Wisconsin, or be an undergraduate with the goal of going on to graduate school in audiology.
2. Have a career goal of pediatric audiology or educational audiology.
3. Submit two letters of recommendations that describe clinical and academic abilities. These letters may be from faculty members or practicum supervisors.
4. Submit a completed application form along with an official transcript of all graduate coursework.

The completed application form, graduate transcript, and letters of recommendation **must be received by the WSHA Foundation on or before June 20, 2009**. Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified.
