

Judy Kulpa Scholarship

This annual scholastic award will be presented at the WSHA Convention each spring. This scholarship is sponsored by the family and friends of Judy Kulpa in honor of her outstanding clinical skills, leadership, and service to the profession of communication disorders.

Guidelines for Application

The scholastic award will be presented at the WSHA Convention in the spring of each year. The amount to be awarded during the WSHA Convention will be \$1,000. While there are no restrictions on how the money is to be spent, the intent is for it to be used toward education or research. To apply for the Judy Kulpa Scholarship, a student must meet the following conditions:

1. Enrollment in an ESB accredited graduate or doctoral program in the state of Wisconsin at the time of application.
2. Majoring in Speech-Language Pathology with an emphasis on health-related service.
3. Completion of two semesters (at least 18 hours) of graduate-level course work.
4. Career goal of working in a hospital setting in speech-language pathology preferred.
5. Demonstrated leadership skills and/or interest in business as it relates to speech-language pathology preferred.
6. Submission of two letters of recommendation, which describe the student's clinical, academic, and leadership abilities. These letters may be from faculty members or supervisors of practicum.
7. Submission of an application form together with an official transcript of graduate course work.

The completed application form, transcripts and two letters of recommendation **must be received by the WSHA Foundation on or before June 20, 2010**. Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified
